Neighborhood Transopoly is an experiential tool for building public consensus and facilitating inclusive, informed transportation planning for communities up to 150,000 residents. Facilitators use customized, multi-layered maps and realistic budgets to guide small groups to practical solutions to transportation problems.



What's Included

All game materials, including custom game map and game pieces, and easy-to-use instructions.

A customized facilitation process.

Post game report with local priorities and recommendations.

Benefits

Public Involvement: Gets constituents thinking about transportation in their community, and gives them the opportunity to participate in visioning for their communities' long-term transportation needs.

Consensus Building: Brings together persons with diverse interests and backgrounds to reach consensus about their communities' long-term transportation needs, avoiding costly and contentious delays.

Education: Teaches constituents about the transportation planning process, and the cost and benefits of various types of transportation infrastructure projects.

Public Policy Development: Establishes community transportation priorities and recommendations.

Community Development: Empowers communities to direct existing transportation money to projects with a high degree of consensus.
